OPENING THOUGHT

KEY SCIPTURE VERSES

- Јони 15:1-8
- HEBREWS 12:11
- JOHN 15:16
- John 15: I-2 NLT I am the TRUE GRAPEVINE, AND MY FATHER IS THE GARDENER. HE CUTS OFF EVERY BRANCH OF MINE THAT DOESN'T PRODUCE FRUIT, AND HE PRUNES THE BRANCHES THAT DO BEAR FRUIT SO THEY WILL PRODUCE EVEN MORE.

KEY POINTS

- God prunes both dead and fruitful branches so we can grow stronger.
- Pruning is not punishment; it is preparation for greater purpose.
- Storms and struggles can also serve as pruning seasons.
- · Abiding in Christ reshapes our desires and our prayers.
- FRUITFULNESS, NOT BUSYNESS, IS THE TRUE SIGN OF DISCIPLESHIP.
